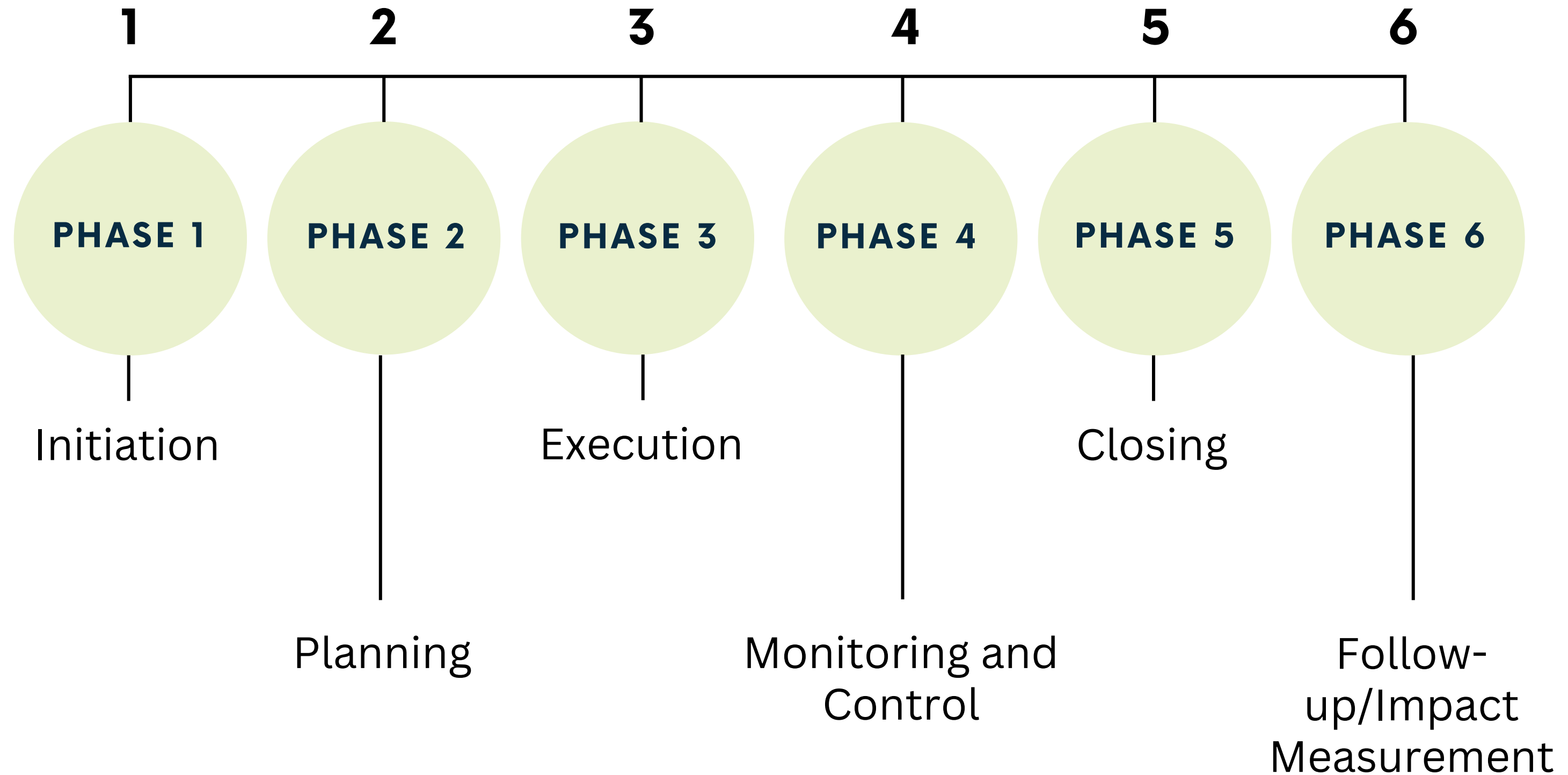

PROJECT MANAGEMENT

- Project management involves applying processes, methods, skills, knowledge, and experience to achieve specific objectives within set parameters.
- In today's dynamic environment, effective project management ensures that organizational goals are met efficiently and effectively.

Project Management Cycle

1.

Initiation

The project manager creates an overview of the project to show stakeholders or potential clients if it provides value and is feasible.

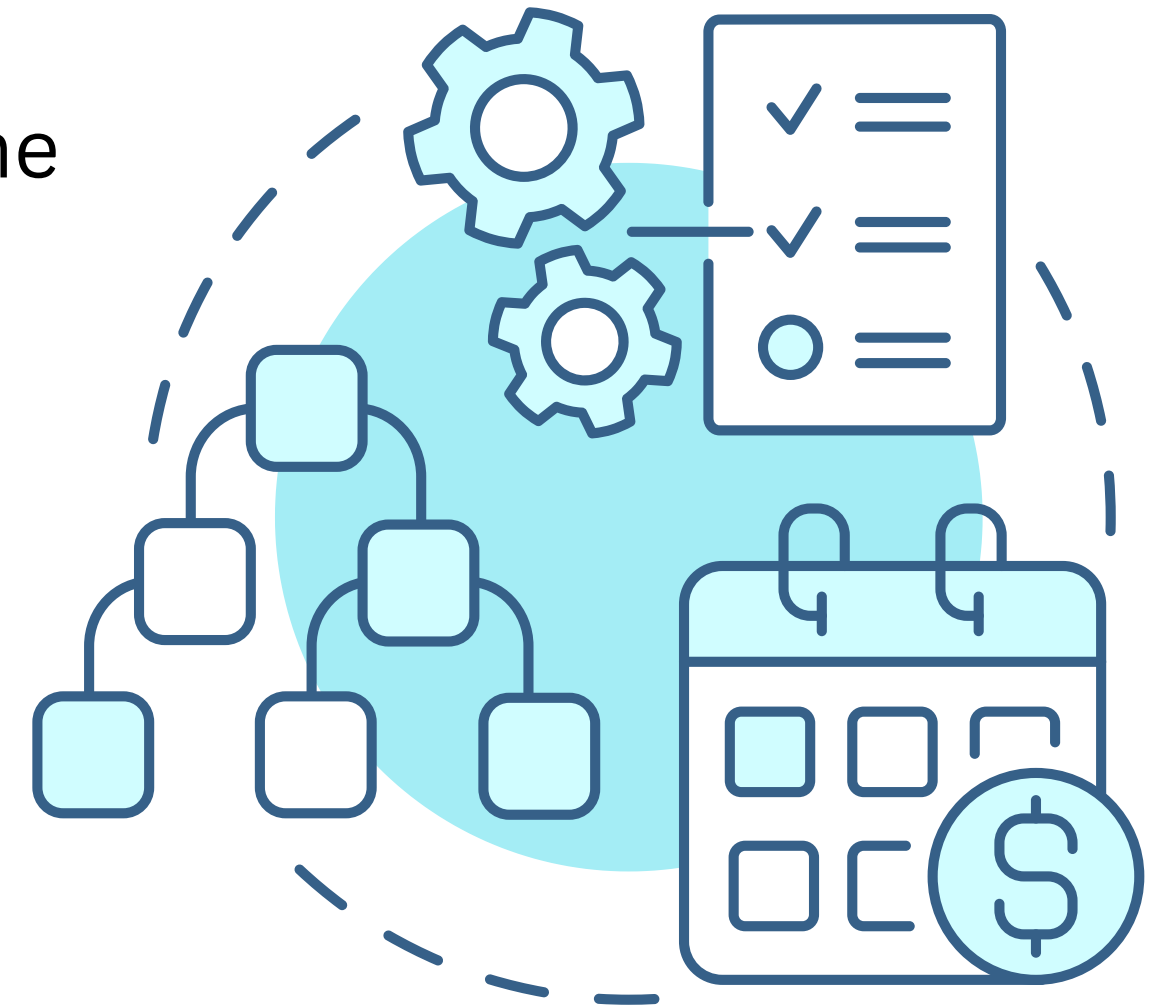


2.

Planning

The project manager develops a roadmap that outlines the project's scope, objectives, and necessary resources to ensure successful execution.

- ☐ Clear goals and deliverables are set
- ☐ Timeline, budget, and resources are allocated
- ☐ Risks and potential challenges are identified

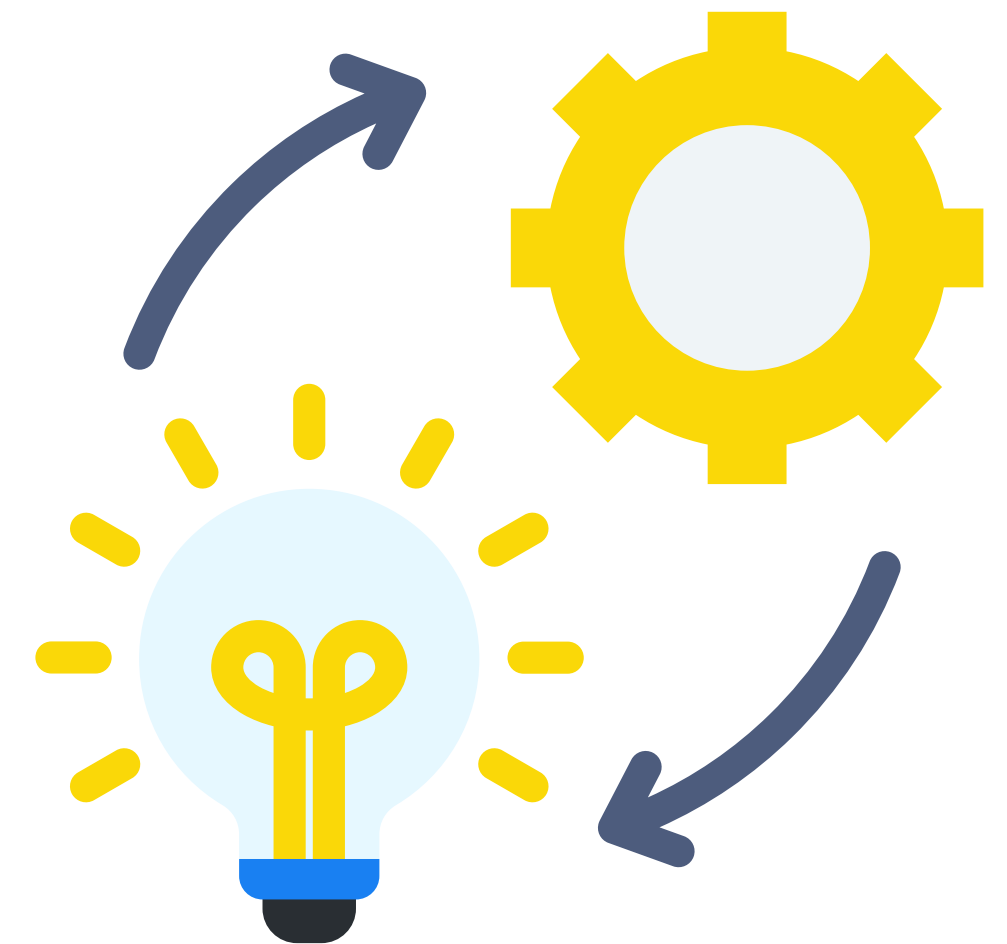


3.

Execution

The project team implements the plan by coordinating tasks, managing resources, and ensuring smooth collaboration.

- ☐ Tasks are assigned and responsibilities are clear
- ☐ Communication and collaboration are maintained
- ☐ Progress is monitored and adjustments are made as needed

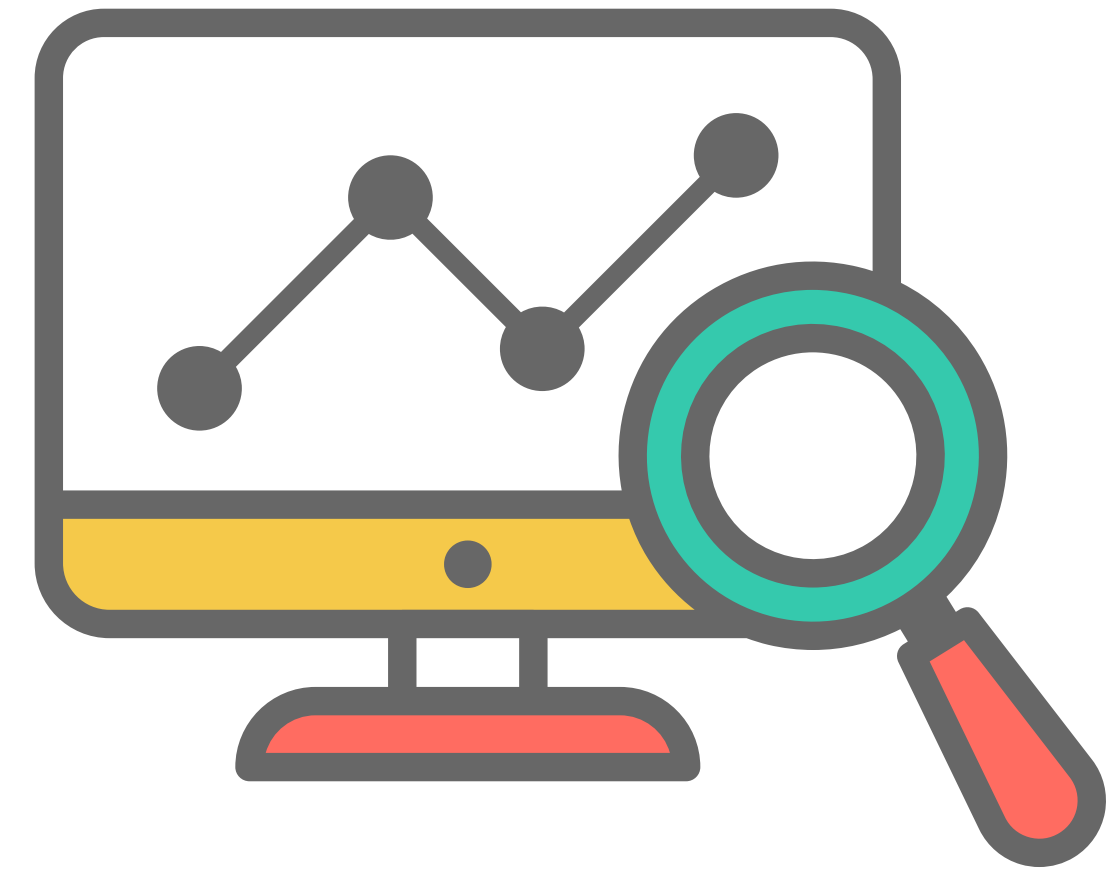


4.

Monitoring & Control

The project manager tracks progress, ensures quality, and mitigates risks to keep the project on track.

- ☐ Performance is measured against key metrics
- ☐ Budget and timeline adherence is reviewed
- ☐ Risks and roadblocks are identified and addressed



5.

Closing

The project is finalized, deliverables are handed over, and lessons learned are documented for future reference.

- ☐ Final review and approvals are completed
- ☐ Deliverables are submitted and project is closed out
- ☐ Team debrief and lessons learned are recorded



6.

Follow-up/Impact Measurement

After project completion, success is evaluated based on outcomes, and improvements are identified for future projects.

- ☐ Impact is assessed against initial goals
- ☐ Stakeholder feedback is collected and analyzed
- ☐ Lessons learned and best practices are documented
